Bubble collapse...

On Sunday night, sadly we had to close the Reception bubble due to being informed about a positive case late afternoon. We spoke to the DfE before texting Reception parents to gain up to date guidance. They advised that <u>all</u> children who were in the setting would have to isolate. We have had an update today and have been informed that children can return to school on Tuesday 30th March, isolating up until Monday 29th March. Most of the staff have not had to isolate due to either not being in work on Friday or not within 2m contact with the positive case. We are disappointed too, we want all children in school. However, we are now pleased that we will see them before Easter. As our Reception children will not be in school this Wednesday, we will celebrate World Book Day with them on Thursday 1st April. The rest of the school will celebrate this Wednesday.

Please note that Lateral Flow Tests cannot be used to take a child out of isolation. Once directed to isolate, you must isolate for 10 days following the positive case. Remember, if anyone in your house has symptoms, your whole household must isolate for 10 days and notify school. The person with symptoms should take a test. Please notify school. If the result comes back positive or negative.

School closes for Easter

School will close on Thursday 1st at 3.10pm for Easter. School will be closed on the Friday – Good Friday. School will re-open on Monday 19th April. School will continue to operate its phased opening times.

Free School Meal vouchers over Easter

On Monday 5th March, parents whose children are in receipt of Free School Meals will be able to collect an Aldi Voucher or Asda Voucher (limited numbers) for each child eligible to the value of £30 to cover dinners over the Easter period. Parents who are eligible will receive a text on Friday 26th March to collect the following week.


World Book Day - Wednesday 24th March 2021
